CONDITIONALS

Conditionals in English are sentences that describe possible situations and their consequences. They typically consist of two parts:

- 1. The "if-clause" (condition) states the condition.
- 2. The main clause (result) states the outcome of the condition.

There are five main types of conditionals:

1. Zero Conditional (General Truths & Facts)

- Used for facts, universal truths, or scientific laws.
- Both clauses are in the present simple.
- Structure: If + present simple, present simple
- Example:
 - If you heat water to 100°C, it boils.
 - If you touch fire, it burns.

2. First Conditional (Real & Possible Future Situations)

- Used for possible future events based on a real condition.
- Structure: If + present simple, will + base verb
- Example:
 - If it rains tomorrow, we will stay indoors.
 - If you study hard, you will pass the exam.

3. Second Conditional (Hypothetical & Unreal Situations in the Present/Future)

- Used for imaginary, unlikely, or impossible situations in the present or future.
- Structure: If + past simple, would + base verb
- Example:
 - o If I were a millionaire, I would travel the world.
 - If she had a car, she would drive to work.

4. Third Conditional (Past Hypotheticals & Regrets)

- Used for situations that didn't happen in the past and their possible outcomes.
- Structure: If + past perfect, would have + past participle
- Example:
 - o If you had studied, you would have passed the test.
 - o If they had left earlier, they wouldn't have missed the train.

5. Mixed Conditionals (Combining Different Time Frames)

• Used when the condition and result refer to different times.

$\textit{Past Condition} \rightarrow \textit{Present Result}$

- Structure: If + past perfect, would + base verb
- Example:
 - If she had studied medicine, she would be a doctor now.

$\textit{Present Condition} \rightarrow \textit{Past Result}$

- Structure: If + past simple, would have + past participle
- Example:
 - If I were taller, I would have joined the basketball team.

EXAMPLES

Zero Conditional (General Truths & Facts)

- 1. If you put ice in the sun, it melts quickly because of the heat. The higher the temperature, the faster it melts.
- 2. If you mix blue and yellow, you get green. This is a basic rule in color theory.
- 3. If you don't water plants, they die. Without water, they cannot perform photosynthesis properly.
- 4. If you press this button, the machine stops immediately. It's an emergency stop function for safety.
- 5. If you don't brush your teeth, they get cavities over time. Bacteria feed on leftover food and damage your enamel.
- 6. If metal is exposed to water and oxygen, it rusts. That's why bridges and iron structures need protective coatings.
- 7. If you stretch a rubber band too much, it snaps. The material has a limit to how far it can stretch.
- 8. If the sun sets, the sky turns dark. This happens because the Earth rotates, changing the amount of sunlight we receive.
- 9. If you eat too much junk food, you gain weight. A high intake of sugar and fat leads to health problems.
- 10. If you leave milk outside in hot weather, it spoils quickly. Bacteria grow faster in warm temperatures.

First Conditional (Real & Possible Future Situations)

- 1. If it rains tomorrow, we will cancel the picnic. Nobody wants to sit in wet grass during lunch!
- 2. If you don't finish your homework on time, the teacher will get angry. She expects everyone to be responsible.
- 3. If you drink too much coffee, you won't be able to sleep at night. Caffeine stays in your system for hours.
- 4. If we leave early, we will reach the airport before the rush hour traffic. That will make the trip much smoother.
- 5. If you exercise regularly, you will feel more energetic throughout the day. Your body will get stronger, and your mind will be more focused.
- 6. If you don't set an alarm, you will oversleep. Then, you will be late for school!
- 7. If she studies hard for the test, she will pass with flying colors. She has all the notes and resources she needs.
- 8. If they don't buy the tickets today, the concert will sell out. There are only a few seats left.
- 9. If you call me after work, I will help you with your project. I'll be free after 6 PM.
- 10. If he doesn't take an umbrella, he will get soaked in the rain. The weather forecast says there will be heavy showers.

Second Conditional (Hypothetical & Unreal Situations in the Present/Future)

- 1. If I were the president, I would make education free for everyone. That way, every child would have a chance to succeed.
- 2. If she had a time machine, she would travel to the future. She is so curious about what the world will be like in 100 years.
- 3. If we lived near the beach, we would go swimming every day. The ocean would be our playground.
- 4. If he didn't spend so much time on video games, he would get better grades. His teachers always complain about his lack of focus.
- 5. If I could fly, I would travel around the world without buying plane tickets. I would see every country from the sky.
- 6. If they spoke French, they would be able to work in Paris. Unfortunately, they don't know the language.

- 7. If she won the lottery, she would buy a big house for her family. They have always dreamed of having a beautiful home.
- 8. If you worked harder, you would earn more money. Your boss appreciates employees who put in effort.
- 9. If he were taller, he would play basketball professionally. His skills are great, but his height is a limitation.
- 10. If aliens existed, they would have contacted us by now. Scientists have been searching for signs of life in space for decades.

Third Conditional (Past Hypotheticals & Regrets)

- 1. If I had studied harder, I would have passed the exam. I regret not putting in more effort.
- 2. If she had set an alarm, she wouldn't have missed the flight. Now, she has to buy another ticket.
- 3. If they had trained more, they would have won the championship. Their opponents were much stronger.
- 4. If you had reminded me, I wouldn't have forgotten your birthday. I feel so bad about it!
- 5. If he had left the house earlier, he wouldn't have gotten stuck in traffic. Now, he is late for the meeting.
- 6. If we had booked the hotel in advance, we would have gotten a cheaper rate. Last-minute bookings are always expensive.
- 7. If she had worn a jacket, she wouldn't have caught a cold. The weather was freezing last night.
- 8. If I had listened to your advice, I wouldn't have made that mistake. You were right all along.
- 9. If they had checked the weather forecast, they wouldn't have gone hiking in the storm. They were completely unprepared.
- 10. If I had known about the job opening, I would have applied. It was a great opportunity!

Mixed Conditionals (Different Time Frames)

- 1. If she had studied medicine, she would be a doctor now. But she chose a different career path.
- 2. If he were more responsible, he wouldn't have lost his job last year. His laziness cost him everything.
- 3. If I had woken up on time, I wouldn't be so tired right now. Missing sleep last night is affecting my whole day.
- 4. If they had saved money in their 20s, they wouldn't have financial problems now. Planning ahead is important.
- 5. If she spoke Spanish, she would have communicated better during her trip to Spain. She struggled because of the language barrier.
- 6. If he had taken driving lessons earlier, he would have his license now. But he kept postponing it.
- 7. If we were millionaires, we would have bought that luxury mansion last year. But we couldn't afford it.
- 8. If you had paid attention in class, you would understand this topic now. You missed important explanations.
- 9. If I had eaten breakfast this morning, I wouldn't be so hungry now. Skipping meals is never a good idea.
- 10. If they were more patient, they wouldn't have quit the project so soon. Success takes time and effort.
