## MARKING THE PRACTICE TESTS

### **Listening and Reading**

Each question in the Listening and Reading tests is worth one mark.

#### Questions which require letter / Roman numeral answers

For questions where the answers are letters or Roman numerals, you should write only the number of answers required. For example, if the answer is a single letter or numeral, you should write only one answer. If you have written more letters or numerals than are required, the answer must be marked wrong.

#### Questions which require answers in the form of words or numbers

- Answers may be written in upper or lower case.
- Words in brackets are optional they are correct, but not necessary.
- Alternative answers are separated by a slash (/).
- If you are asked to write an answer using a certain number of words and/or (a) number(s), you
  will be penalised if you exceed this. For example, if a question specifies an answer using NO
  MORE THAN THREE WORDS and the correct answer is 'black leather coat', the answer 'coat of
  black leather' is incorrect.
- In questions where you are expected to complete a gap, you should only transfer the necessary missing word(s) onto the answer sheet. For example, to complete 'in the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_', where the correct answer is 'morning', the answer 'in the morning' would be *incorrect*.
- All answers require correct spelling (including words in brackets).
- Both US and UK spelling are acceptable and are included in the answer key.
- All standard alternatives for numbers, dates and currencies are acceptable.
- All standard abbreviations are acceptable.
