Mills in Britain

General

- Use hydropower
 - processes such as **31** and grinding
 - materials such as flour, wood, paper
- Classification – based on wheel **32**

History

- Early examples in Roman times
- Approximately 6,000 mills listed in Domesday Book (compiled in **33**)
- Double number of mills 300 years later
- Purpose of mills often changed:
 - **34** for goods
 - material availability

Location

- Riverbank
 - flow from river
 - **35** changes to water levels
- Set back from bank
 - man-made channel
 - creation of millpond to **36** water

Other types of mills

- **37** mill
 - located on coasts, at inlets, or estuaries
 - River Thames – estimated **38** mills in 18th century
- Ship mill
 - floating mill in fastest section of river
- Windmills
 - cheaper, more flexible than watermills
 - quicker **39** around the country
- Steam power more flexible than windmills and watermills
 - relocation for better transport links, i.e. close to **40**
