

Preservation and Generation

Original volume of water = 5.5 billion gallons per hour

• large amount of water is 35

US/Canadian governments – preservation efforts

- building of underwater 36 to redirect flow
- in 1969, repairs took place on American Falls

Energy generation

Hydroelectricity – world's first power plant (opened in **37**)

- provides energy for 38 households
- generates 5 million kilowatts

Generating electricity with the Falls helps slow 39 of infrastructure

• reduced flow at **40** to collect more water for energy generation
